The food distribution is partially funded by Calvary Church Los Gatos in the United States which helped poor families facing hard times. We bought and distributed food to six families. - 1) 50kg (110 pounds) of rice
- 2) 2.5kg (6 pounds) of salt
- 3) 1kg (2 pounds) of Monosodium Glutamate
- 4) Six bottles of soy sauce
- 5) Six bottles of fish sauce
- 6) Two boxes of instant noodles
- 7) Ten cans of sardines.

The families receiving food are:

1)Mr. Sart Soun, 56 years old, and his wife Shrah Leap in Romchek village. Four dependent



3) Mrs. Mith Choeun, a widow living in Romchek Kandal village with three dependent sons. Her husband abandoned her in 2016. She is living in difficult conditions in her village. Her income comes from selling cakes in the village, and from collecting bottles and cans for recycling





6) Mr. Kea Keoun, a retired 57-year-old soldier, and his wife Seang Norn in Preyknol village. They have custodial care of their 10-year-old grandchild who attends primary school. Seang Norn has osteoporosis. Consequently her bones were broken in pieces from hip to heels. She cannot walk or move without someone to help her. She does not have a wheelchair. Her granddaughter provides home health care for her after school. Her husband went to hospital in March 2020 with serious tuberculosis and hepatitis. There is no prognosis for a cure.

- 4) Mr. Sam Oun, 50 years old and his wife, Moeun Thoeun in O'Tameng village. They have five dependent children. They collect bottles and cans for recycling. Sometimes they work from dawn to dusk as laborers for people who need their service. They average \$3.75 per day. Sometimes they have no income and no food on that day.
- 5) Mr. Soy Chheang, 56 years old and his wife Uy Sokhan in Romchek village, They have no children. They collect bottles and cans for recycling. Sometimes they work from dawn to dusk as laborers for people who need their service. Health challenges interfere with their ability to work. They average \$6.25 per day. Sometimes they have no income and no food on that day.



Currently this family relies on donations of food from their neighbors. Sometimes granddaughter begs for food from people. When her husband was healthy he collected bottles and cans for recycling averaging 60 cents per day. Without recycling they have no income. They live in their neighbor's hut. They don't know when the owner will ask them to move out.
