Food distribution for Flood Relief

On December 21st, 2020 Cambodian Ministries for Christ distributed food to families affected by flooding in Cambodia. The food distribution is partially funded by churches in the United States which help families facing hard times. We bought and distributed food to 50 families totaling 227 people.



Each family received:

- 1) 110 pound of rice
- 2) 6 pounds of salt
- 3) 2 pounds of Monosodium Glutamate
- 4) Six bottles of soy sauce
- 5) Six bottles of fish sauce
- 6) Two boxes of instant noodles
- 7) Ten cans of sardines.

The families receiving food are:

1) 35 people from eight families living in difficult condition in Romchek Kandal villlage, Anlong Veng District, Oddor Meanchey province received food. Their income come from selling cakes and collecting bottles and cans for recycling averaging \$2.75 per day. Sometimes they work from dawn to dusk as laborers for people who need their service. Sometimes they have no income and no food on that day because of the flooding.



2) 24 people from six families living in difficult conditions in Romchek Khang Lech villlage, Anlong Veng district, Oddor Meanchey province received food. Their income comes from selling cakes and collecting bottles and cans for recycling averaging \$2.75 per day. Sometimes they work from dawn to dusk as laborers for people who need their service, Sometimes they have no income and no food on that day.

3) 35 people from seven families living in difficult

conditions in Romchek Khang Ket villlage, Anlong Veng district, Oddor Meanchey province received food. Their income comes from selling cakes and collecting bottles and cans for recycling averaging \$2.75 per day. Sometimes they work from dawn to dusk as laborers for people who need their service, Sometimes they have no income and no food on that day because of the flooding.

4) 25 people from four families living in difficult conditions in O'Tameng villlage, Anlong Veng distric, Oddor Meanchey province received food.
